



## DIRECTOR'S REFLECTION ON 2020

2020 is synonymous with perfect vision, however the year 2020 proved to be a difficult read.

On March 16, 2020 the Board of Trustees motioned the Library would close due to the State of Emergency and Public Health Threat of COVID 19.

No materials would be due during the closure. Staff would be available remotely to answer questions and to help with digital collection access. The Board motioned to redirect and increase funding to the Library's digital collections, with the expectation the Library would close for two weeks.

We did not return to the physical library until June 15, 2020. We returned to a Library and its Services greatly changed by COVID. Quarantining of materials, hourly cleaning of high touch surfaces, reduced capacity, social distancing, masks, screening questions, staff temperature checks, and polycarbonate barriers became part of our safety routine.

Curbside pick up, Take and Make craft kits, Zoom programming, online Summer Reading, weekly YouTube story times, and remote library card registration became new services.

2020 was difficult, however the above services improved access to those not physically able to visit the Library. Many of these services will remain when we safely return to in person programming. 2020 has shaped the vision of Library Services. Going forward the Library will be available from home, curbside, or in person. *Kimberly Iraci*
